THE FOOTBALL STORY

TWENTY FIVE REPORTED TO COACH BUEHLER IN RESPONSE TO HIS CALL FOR FOOTBALL PRACTICE. OF THESE, NINETEEN FINISHED THE SEASON. OF THE TWENTY FIVE REPORTING, EIGHT WERE LETTER MEN. THEY WERE MILLER, DREKE, R. NEGUS, B. NEGUS, DUANE SCHIMMER, CARNAHAN, W. WEDE, AND SCHREINER.

AFTER THREE WEEKS OF STIFF, HARD PRACTICE, THE TIGERS MET THEIR FIRST OPPONENT OF THE \$49 SEASON ON THE HOME FIELD FRIDAY NITE, SEPT. 16. IT WAS A RATHER STICKY NIGHT, BUT THE BUEHLERMEN PLAYED HARD STRAIGHT FOOTBALL AND DEFEATED PETERSON 25 TO 0.

THE SCHEDULE CALLED FOR A TRIP TO ORANGE CITY THE FOLLOWING WEEK WHERE ONE OF THE STRONGEST TEAMS IN NORTHWEST IOWA MADE ITS HOME. THE SCORE AT THE HALF-TIME WAS 7 TO 0 IN FAVOR OF THE DUTCHMEN. IN THE SECOND HALF THE HARD DRIVING BACKS AND THE HEAVIER LINE OF ORANGE CITY WERE TOO MUCH FOR THE TIGERS, AND THE FINAL SCORE WAS 34 TO 0.

THE NEXT GAME WAS PLAYED AT HOME WITH PAULLINA. THIS WAS A HARD, RUGGED GAME ALL THE WAY, WITH PAULLINA HOLDING A HALF TIME ADVANTAGE OF L3 TO 6. THE SECOND HALF WAS PLAYED IN THE SHADOWS OF THE PAULLINA GOAL BUT THE MANY SCORING CHANCES WERE MUFFED AND THE GAME ENDED 13 TO 6. THE TIGERS PLAYED ONE OF THEIR BEST GAMES OF THE SEASON CARRYING THE BALL DEEP INTO THE OPPONENT'S TERRITORY BUT MUST COULDN'T PUT IT OVER.

PRIMGHAR AT HOME ON THE NEXT FRIDAY HIGHLIGHTED BY HOMECOMING WAS THE SCHEDULE. THE BULL DOGS WITH A SMOOTH RUNNING AND HARD HITTING TEAM WERE IN LEAD ALL THE WXY. FINAL SCORE WAS PRIMGHAR 32 SUTHERLAND O.

ON OCT. L4, THE TIGERS JOURNEYED TO ALTA. THEY OUT-GAINED ALTA BUT LOST WHEN THEY LET A LONG FORWARD PASS GO FOR A TOUCHDOWN IN THE CLOSING MINUTES OF THE FIRST HALF. THEY CONTINUED TO MAKE LONG GAINS THE SECOND HALF BUT WERE UNABLE TO SCORE. THE GAME ENDED 7 TO 0 WITH ALTA WINNING.

ON THE FOLLOWING FRIDAY THE BUEHLERMEN JOURNEDYD TO HARTLEY, WHERE THEY PLAYED ANOTHER RUGGED BALL GAME, BUT WERE DEFEATED 20 TO 12. HARTLEY DID ALL OF THEIR SCORING THE FIRST HALF. THE SECOND HALF WAS ALL SUTHERLAND'S BUT THE LEAD WAS TOO MUCH TO OVERCOME.

THE SCHEDULE LISTED ONE OPEN DATE BUT COACH BUEHLER WAS ANXIOUS TO KEEP THE BOYS GOING SO ARRANGED A SCRIMMAGE GAME ON MONDAY WITH THE LE MARS "B" SQUAD. PLAYING ON THE HOME FIELD, THE TIGERS RUBBED THEIR NOBES IN THE DIRT TO THE TUNE OF 25 TO 6.

MILFORD WAS NEXT. THEY HAD LOST ONLY ONE GAME AND WERE REALLY UP FOR THE GAME. EVERYTHING WORKED FOR THEM AND THEY GAINED BY LONG RUNS CONSISTENTLY. FINAL SCORE WAS 30 TO 0 IN MILFORD'S FAVOR.


ON ARMISTICE DAY THE TIGERS MET SIOUX RAPIDS ON THE HOME FIELD. THIS WAS A SLOW BALL GAME, BUT CLOSE ALL THE WAY. THE BUEHLERMEN GARNERED THE SAME NUMBER OF TOUCHDOENS BUT DID NOT CONVERT AS DID THE SIOUX RAPIDS BOYS. THE FINISH FOUND SUTHERLAND TRAILING 14 TO 12.



THE BASKETBALL STORY

WE STARTED OUT THE 49-50 SEASON WITH 2L BOYS REPORTING FOR THE FIRST PRACTICE, WITH THE FOLLOWING FIVE LETTERMEN BEING INCLUDED: BOB NEGUS, ROGER NEGUS, BOB MILLER, DUANE SCHIMMER, AND TOM DRAKE. THE FIRST GAME WAS PLAYED AT HOME AGAINST SIOUX RAPIDS. THE BOYS WERE "CLICKING" AND THE FINAL COUNT WAS 57-38, IN FAVOR OF THE TIGERS.

WE SLUMPED A LITTLE IN THE NEXT FEW GAMES, LOSING THEM BY VERY CLOSE MARGINS. THE NEXT GAME WHICH WE CAME BACK AND WON WAS THE MONETA GAME, THE SCORE BEING 46-17. AFTER CHRISTMAS VACATION, DURING WHICH WE HAD TWO SCRIMMAGE GAMES WITH THE LE MARS TEAM, WE STARTED OFF WITH ALTA. IT WAS A BAD NIGHT FOR THE TIGERS, AND WE WOUND UP ON THE SHORT END'OF A 63-36 COUNT.

THE FOLLOWING FRIDAY, HOWEVER, THE TIGERS PULLED A CLOSE ONE OUT OF THE FIRE AT AURELIA, WHICH WAS A MORAL VICTORY TO SAY THE LEAST. SCORE WAS 40-34. THE SEASON WENT QUITE FAST FROM THEN ON, WITH THE STORY STILL BEING IF WE LOST, IT WAS BY ONLY A FEW POINTS, BUT IF WE WON, IT WAS GENERALLY BY A GOODLY MARGIN.

IN THE COUNTY TOURNAMENT, WHICH WAS HELD AT SHELDON, THE TIGERS DREW THE SHELDON ORABS FOR THE FIRST ROUND OPENER. CONSIDERED THE UNDERDOGS, THE TIGERS BEAT THE ORABS IN A HIGH-SCORING.CONTEST, ENDING UP 58-47. THE FOLLOWING NIGHT THE TIGERS WERE TAKEN OUT OF THE TOURNEY BY THE PAULLINA PANTHERS, WHO WENT ON TO BECOME COUNTY CHAMPS. Score WAS 45-32.

IN THE SECTIONAL, WHICH WAS HELD AT PRIMGHAR, THE TIGERS WENT THROUGH TO THE FINALS BY BEATING ARCHER IN THE FIRST GAME, 42-38, AND GAZA IN THE SECOND ROUND, 66-29, AND MET PRIMGHAR IN THE FINALS. THIS GAME WAS A COLD ONE FOR THE TIGERS, WHO COULDN'T SEEM TO HIT THE BASKET. THEY ENDED THE SEASON BY GETTING BEATEN BY PRIMGHAR 39-32.

A GLANCE AT THE "WON AND LOST" COLUMN DOESN'T TELL AN ACCURATE STORY OF THE SEASON, HOWEVER, OR REVEAL THE MERITS OF THE TEAM. BY A COMPARISON OF OUR TOTAL POINTS FOR THE SEASON, WHICH WERE 890, AND OUR OPPONENTS, WHICH WERE 886, ONE CAN READILY SEE THAT WE WEREN'T OUTSCORED AS A SEASON-AL TEAM. HE POINTS SEEMED TO BE DISTRIBUTED IN SUCH A MANNER THAT WE WERE EDGED FROM MANY OF OUR GAMED BY A VERY FEW POINTS. FOLLOWING IS THE SEASON'S RECORD. WE PLAYED A TOTAL OF 21 GAMES THIS SEASON. OUR AVERAGE POINTS PER GAME WERE 42.4.
