





FOREWORD








SENIOR TRIP





We will and bequeath to the Sophomores our ability to get along together as a class. You'll always have better times that way.




The Sutherland Tigers met the Milford Pioneers October 7 to meet another downfall of 29-0. The fight was great but we were lacking spirit.



The Homecoming parade started at 1:30 including the band, football players, Queen and attendents, floats, and the grade students riding their bikes.


