asteroid. Here we received our new cook, Kay Hanlan, who stayed with us until our next stop.

Miss Lynch requested that Joan Youngers should become our cook when Kay Hanlan left. Sheldon Hughes and Harry Bradstreet came aboard for a short time to repair our ship at Planet V.

Our crew was becoming rather small; therefore, Miss Challand enlisted the aid of John Beaman, Virgean Gano, Rose Lyman, Kenneth Meyer, Robert Meyer, and Lester Steele on Planet VI.

It would now be a span of two years before we reached the next planet. As Mr. Sutter decided that more help was needed on this extensive journey, David Bruns, Marvin Hagen, Helen Hallbauer, Glen Kramme, John Kramme, and Randy Rohwer helped to man our ship. Rose Lyman and Stephen Gentry did not desire to take this two year trip and joined another crew. After one year, David Bruns, Virgean Gano, Glen Kramme, John Kramme, Joan Youngers, and Robert Zoet decided to leave us. Another ship took them to their destinations.

We arrived at the Planet High and were initiated into a four-year program of advanced training. John Beaman, and Randy Rohwer, decided to take another program. Three new members--John Click, Rodney Johannsen, and Judy Saienga--were transferred to us. Everyone continued through the second year; but in the third year, Robert and Kenneth Meyer left for the Planet Everly. We were badly in need of some specialists; then Freda Brown, Verna Laursen, Leroy Steffens, Richard Schweitzer, and Carroll Wall came to our rescue. In the fourth year, two special aviationists, Hadley Castor and Gary Gould, were added to our crew. Four members--Freda Brown, Helen Hallbauer, Darlene Litka, and Carroll Wall were transferred to other programs.

In this year of nineteen hundred and sixty, we, a crew of twenty-three were graduated from this training program in order to continue toward new horizons.



HOMECOMING

The Homecoming festivities at S.H.S. officially opened Thursday evening, October 9, when a dreary night was set aglow by a huge bonfire. The Tigers next traveled to Aurelia where they were trounced 47-0. The Tigers were in scoring position at times but they could not generate enough steam to get rolling.


